I am not sure if you are thinking swarming? I spent some time on the phone with a friend who shared with me that he was getting some swarm calls. Another contacted me about queen cells (swarm cells) in a hive he had examined. Why are bees swarming? Quite frankly, I don't know. I look at fall swarming (it by the way is not rare and I have seen it a time or two) as a suicide event for a fall swarm. Remember that old adage "not worth a fly" to describe a late swarm. One possibility could be late season feeding. I am looking into that possibility for an upcoming issue.

Too much warmth and too much food may actually harm a colony of bees when the weather turns cold. I remember a quote by A.I. Root in his autobiography about providing bees a warm building with heat to help them survive a winter. *It was the biggest mistake he ever made!*
